PWS&D Receives Funding from Canadian Government for Maternal Health Programs

As one of the recipients for funding through the Government of Canada's Muskoka Initiative on Maternal, Newborn and Child Health, over the next three years, PWS&D will receive \$1,519,610 from the government to carry out programs that will improve the health and save the lives of women and children in Malawi and Afghanistan.

In Afghanistan, the project will improve women's overall health and lower maternal death rates by training birth attendants, improving health facilities and helping to enhance community attitudes toward maternal health.

In Malawi, changing misconceptions about reproductive health and increasing access to obstetric services will reduce maternal and neonatal deaths. Up to 17,000 children will have access to and benefit from improved nutrition and health care services.

Together with donations from individuals and congregations across Canada, the government funds will help PWS&D and our program partners make lasting improvements in the lives of vulnerable women and children.
